Michael Callahan, President of Marc Gold and Associates, will be the speaker for the event. Michael will address "Customized Employment: Assuring Access to Employment for All". This presentation will address the unique features that distinguish customized employment from traditional, competitive jobs. Examples and stories of individuals with a variety of disabilities will be discussed. The role of the Discovery process, developed by Mr. Callahan

and his colleagues, will be described.



Michael has consulted throughout the U.S., Canada, and Europe regarding employment and transition for the past 30 years. He has worked with Marc Gold and Associates (MG&A) for 34 years, and has served as president of the organization since Marc Gold's death in 1982. He is co-author of two popular books on employment. He is currently a national board member for TASH and was a founding board member of APSE.
